

Bob Zelinski DIRECTOR OF ATHLETICS

Bob Zelinski was named director of Athletics and Intramurals at College of Central Florida in September 1999. He was named director of Wellness Education, Athletics and Intramurals in July 2001.

Zelinski has more than 26 years of athletic and administrative experience in developing and directing educational, athletic, community and intramural programs. He has directed the Florida College System Activities Association Baseball Championship for 20 years, served as tournament director for three FCSAA Volleyball Championships, directed two National Junior College Swimming and Diving Championships, and served as associate director of 14 NJCAA National Volleyball Championships. He has created a highly successful wellness education programs and employee wellness programs.

Zelinski currently serves as the National Junior College Athletic Association Region VIII director for men's athletics and as the FCSAA men's athletic commissioner. He serves on the Executive Board for the Council for Athletic Affairs and is a member of the FCSAA Executive Committee. Zelinski's service also extends nationally as he chairs the NJCAA

eligibility committee, serves on the NJCAA national baseball and men's basketball committee. He is also a member of the NJCAA Strategic Planning Sub-Committee on Division Re-structuring, and the NJCAA Executive Committee.

Zelinski came to CF from Miami-Dade College where he served as chairperson of the Department of Health, Wellness, Physical Education, and Athletics. He created an extensive wellness program for faculty and staff, developed educational curriculum, and developed facilities for the improvement of teaching and learning in health and wellness.

Zelinski has received numerous honors for his contributions to Florida community college athletics. He was inducted into

the FCSAA Hall of Fame, presented an appreciation award by the FCSAA Baseball Coaches and has been recognized by many groups and organizations for his leadership and devotion to community college students. He was selected as the NJCAA Region Director of the Year and was presented with the Men's Tennis Coaches Association service award.

Zelinski earned his Bachelor of Arts degree from Florida Atlantic University and his Master of Science Degree at Nova Southeastern University in Educational Administration. He and his wife Donna Riley have two children, Korin and Kit.

Tim Ryan HEAD COACH, MEN'S BASKETBALL

Tim Ryan enters his 12th season as the College of Central Florida's Men's Basketball Coach. He led the Patriots to the program's first-ever NJCAA National Basketball Championship in 2013. Coach Ryan has the longest streak of consecutive appearances in the FCSAA State Tournament with 10 appearances. Over the past 11 seasons at CF, Coach Ryan has produced seven All-Americans, more than any other junior college in the country.

Last summer, Coach Ryan was asked to participate with USA basketball. He was an on-the-court coach for the 19U team in Colorado Springs at the Olympic Training Facility. The 19U team went on the win the Gold Medal in Prague.

A former player at New York City's Power Memorial Academy and Wilkes College in Wilkes-Barre, Pa., Ryan's coaching career began in 1993 at Clearwater Central Catholic High School, where he spent four seasons coaching teams from the freshmen to varsity level. He was named head coach at St. Petersburg Catholic High School in 1997, and led the program to its first two Pinellas County Private School Tournament championships and the school's second and third appearances in the regional playoffs.

Ryan enjoyed similar results upon his move to the college ranks. He spent three successful seasons as associate head coach at Hillsborough Community College in Tampa, where he helped lead the Hawks to an average of 20 wins per season, two state tournament appearances, and a Suncoast Conference Championship.

Coach Ryan was also heavily involved in AAU with successful teams for both girls and boys. He also coached at the prestigious Five-Star Basketball Camp. Ryan's work at CF extends beyond the basketball team

as he is the coordinator of CF's Intramural Sports Program and runs the popular CAMP PATRIOT basketball camp for local youth annually in December and the summer.

Ryan holds a master's degree in Psychology from National-Louis University. He and his wife, JoAnne, have four children, Tim, Nicole, Veronica and Tommy.







Tito Arias enters his sixth season as an assistant coach with the College of Central Florida's men's basketball team and his eighth overall as a college assistant. This is Arias' second stint with the Patriots, first serving from 2008-2013.

While previously with the Patriots, Arias helped the program win the NJCAA National Championship in 2013 and was a big part of the school keeping its run of nine straight trips to the FCSAA State Tournament going. He also was part of a



program that became the first team in Mid-Florida Conference history to win three straight conference titles (2011-2013). Arias played a key part in coaching four NJCAA All-Americans at CF.

Last season, Arias helped Paine, Ga. to its single-season record for most wins since the program began in 1997. With the help of Arias, who worked in recruiting, strength and conditioning, opponent scouting, player development and academic monitoring, the Lions earned their third straight conference tournament appearance. Originally from Miami, Arias earned his

bachelor's degree in Recreation and Tourism Management from the University of Maine at Machias. After a successful prep career for coach Charlie Funk, Arias played two seasons at Miami Dade College for Butch Estes.

From there, he played his final two seasons at the University of Maine Machias for Coach Brac Brady and was team captain as a senior (2006-2007 season). After he finished his playing career, Arias coached under Brady in 2007-2008, before making the trek to Ocala and helping the Patriots to their most successful run ever.







Chris Shearon TEAM MANAGER, MEN'S BASKETBALL

Chris Shearon enters his third season as team manager for the College of Central Florida's men's basketball team. His responsibilities with the Patriots include shooting game film and coordinating the basketball locker room. Shearon, an Ocala native, currently attends CF. He is studying Business Management and hopes to work with a professional sports team one day. In his free time, he enjoys volunteering at his church.



Nick Jahnke VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT

Nick Jahnke enters his first year as a volunteer assistant with the CF men's basketball program. Jahnke has coached at the high school, middle school and AAU levels. During his coaching career, he has spent time at St. Petersburg Northside, New Port Richey Gulf, and Crystal River High, where he had served as an assistant for the last four years.

Currently, Jahnke is finishing up his bachelor's degree in Sports Coaching from the United States Sports Academy. The Kenosha, Wisc. native lives in Inverness with his wife Jasmine.



Jeff Lorenzo VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT

Jeff Lorenzo begins his first year as a volunteer assistant for the CF men's basketball program. From 2001-2006, he served as lead assistant for women's basketball at the University of the Sciences in Pennsylvania. During his time there, he organized the Northeast Region all-star game from 2001-2005. Lorenzo, a graduate of Rowan University, has also served as an assistant coach at several high schools in New Jersey, as well as AAU programs.



Jake Zehnder VOLUNTEER STUDENT ASSISTANT

This is Jake Zehnder's first year as a volunteer student assistant for the CF men's basketball program. Over the past two years, Zehnder has spent time as an assistant coach at The Rock School in Gainesville. Prior to that, he was an assistant coach at Gainesville P.K. Younge. Zehnder also coached the Gainesville Kings AAU program from 2011-2014. His U4-U6 teams have won numerous tournaments, including the well-known Disney Easter Classic.

Ryan Inducted into FCSAA Men's Basketball Hall of Fame

uring his time as the head coach at the College of Central Florida, Tim Ryan has taken the program to great heights.

For his efforts, Ryan, who led the Patriots to the NJCAA National Championship last season and to the FCSAA State Tournament on nine straight occasions, was inducted into the FCSAA Men's Basketball Hall of Fame on March 8 during halftime of the NJCAA Region VIII/FCSAA Men's State Championship Game held at the College of Central Florida.

Under Ryan, the Patriots have qualified for the state tournament 10 times in 11 seasons. CF is 254-103 under Ryan, who became the first coach in Mid-Florida Conference history to lead a program to three straight conference titles.

He also earned state and national coach of the year honors in 2013.

"It's certainly a great honor. You don't go into coaching thinking you're going to go into the hall of fame," Ryan said. "It's something I never shot for, but as the years went on and my numbers got better, it was something that I thought could happen. I just think how fortunate I have been to be in a situation like this and follow former CF coach Gene

Smithson. He did a great job with this program; I've just keep building it."

Ryan credits CF Athletic Director Bob Zelinski, former CF President Charles Dassance and current CF President Dr. Jim Henningsen with helping him reach the top.

"They have put me in the situation for this to happen and being voted into the hall of fame ranks up there with the greatest achievements I've had in my career," he said.

When Ryan accepted his current position more than 11 years ago, he said he had to stop and take it all in.

"When I got the job, I left Ocala to see my family," said Ryan, who commuted from Pinellas County to Ocala four days per week for his first five years as head coach at CF. "I stopped at the I-75 rest area south of State Road 200, called my wife and said, 'I can't believe they are going to pay me to coach full-time,' because I would have done it for nothing.""

Ryan joins Dr. Bill Campion (1994), Smithson (1998), Simon Johnson (2008/Hampton College), and Dr. Jim Harvey (2013), as members of the CF athletic program to receive

state hall of fame honors in men's basketball.

Zelinski said Ryan's induction into the Hall of Fame was well-deserved.

"His record of achievement with conference titles, state tournament appearances and the national championship, speaks for itself," said Zelinski. "Tim's commitment to FCSAA basketball and his leadership throughout the state have been outstanding and this induction is recognition of his work and success."

Joining Ryan in the 2014 hall of fame class for men's basketball is current St. Petersburg coach Earnest Crumbley, former Miami Dade athletic director Jim Cox and Chipola's Alice Pendergrass.

Crumbley has the most wins among active men's coaches in the state at 289 and led SPC to the state title in 2002, while Cox was the helm of the MDC program and now runs the scorer's table for the NBA's Miami Heat.

Pendergrass was a longtime contributor to the state tournament, which had been held in Chipola since 1996.



ONE OF THE BEST

The CF men's basketball team qualified for the FCSAA/NJCAA Region VIII Tournament for the ninth straight season, the longest current, consecutive streak in the state. The streak is also the third longest in state history dating back to the tournament's origin in 1961. Overall, the Patriots have qualified for the state tournament 10 times in the last 11 years.

GETTING IT DONE

Over the past two seasons, CF is 14-5 against state tournament qualifiers, including a 5-4 mark during the 2013-2014 season. The Patriots also went 7-4 against teams ranked in the FCSAA State Coaches Poll.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION

After winning the NJCAA National Championship in 2013, CF started off ranked No. 1 in the preseason NJCAA National Poll for the second time in six seasons. CF is the third Florida team to win a national championship in the 75-year history of the NJCAA National Tournament.

STATE SCENE

CF ended the regular season a year ago ranked No. 6 in the FCSAA State Coaches Poll and have been a mainstay under Coach Tim Ryan.

RUNNING PAST ITS RIVAL

With its 69-65 win over Santa Fe in the Mid-Florida Conference Tournament Championship Game last season, CF has defeated its closest rival in 14 of the last 17 meetings. CF is 3-0 in MFC tournament championship games since 2008, with two of those wins coming over the Saints.

HALL OF FAMER

CF men's basketball coach Tim Ryan was inducted into the FCSAA Men's Basketball Hall of Fame in March 2014. Ryan led the Patriots to the NJCAA National Championship in 2013 and joins Dr. Bill Campion, Gene Smithson, Simon Johnson and Dr. Jim Harvey, as members of the CF athletic family to receive hall of fame honors from the state in men's basketball.

TOUGH AT HOME

Since December 2012, CF has lost just six games in the Gymnasium. The Patriots extended their home-court winning streak to 33 games last December, before a loss to Palm Beach State. CF also built a 21-game winning streak at home against Mid-Florida Conference opponents before a loss last season to FSC-Jacksonville. The CF national championship squad was unbeaten at home at Patriot Gym.

CONFERENCE DOMINANCE

CF has won three of the last four Mid-Florida Conference championships in men's basketball. The Patriots streak ended last season by Daytona State, the only team other than CF to win the MFC since 2009.

THE LAST TIME IT HAPPENED

CF goes into the season without a returning starter for the first time since 2008, but history has been on its side when it turns over most of the roster. In 2008, the Patriots lost just one conference game and qualified for the state tournament with nine straight conference wins behind Ricardo Ratliffe.
