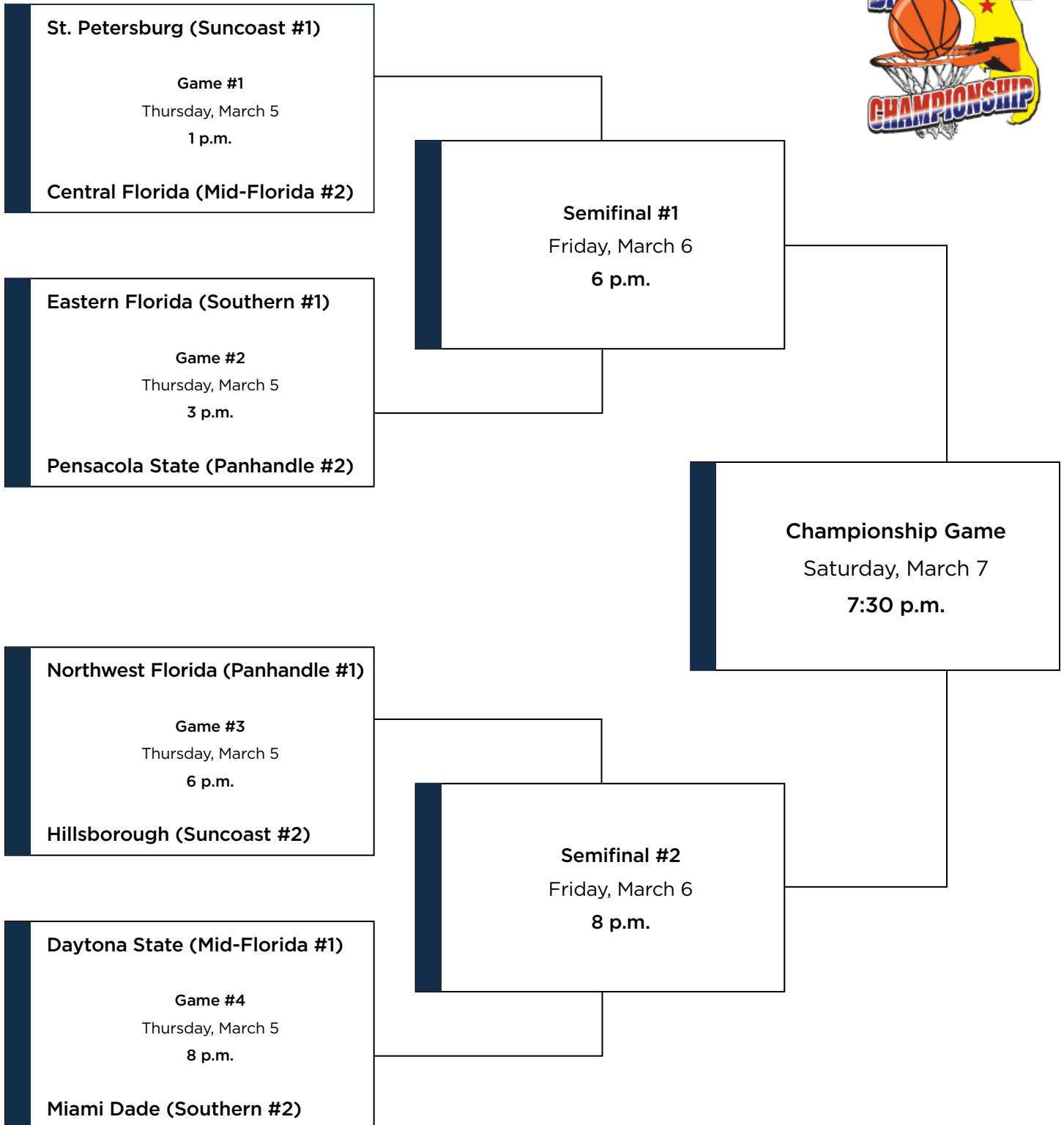

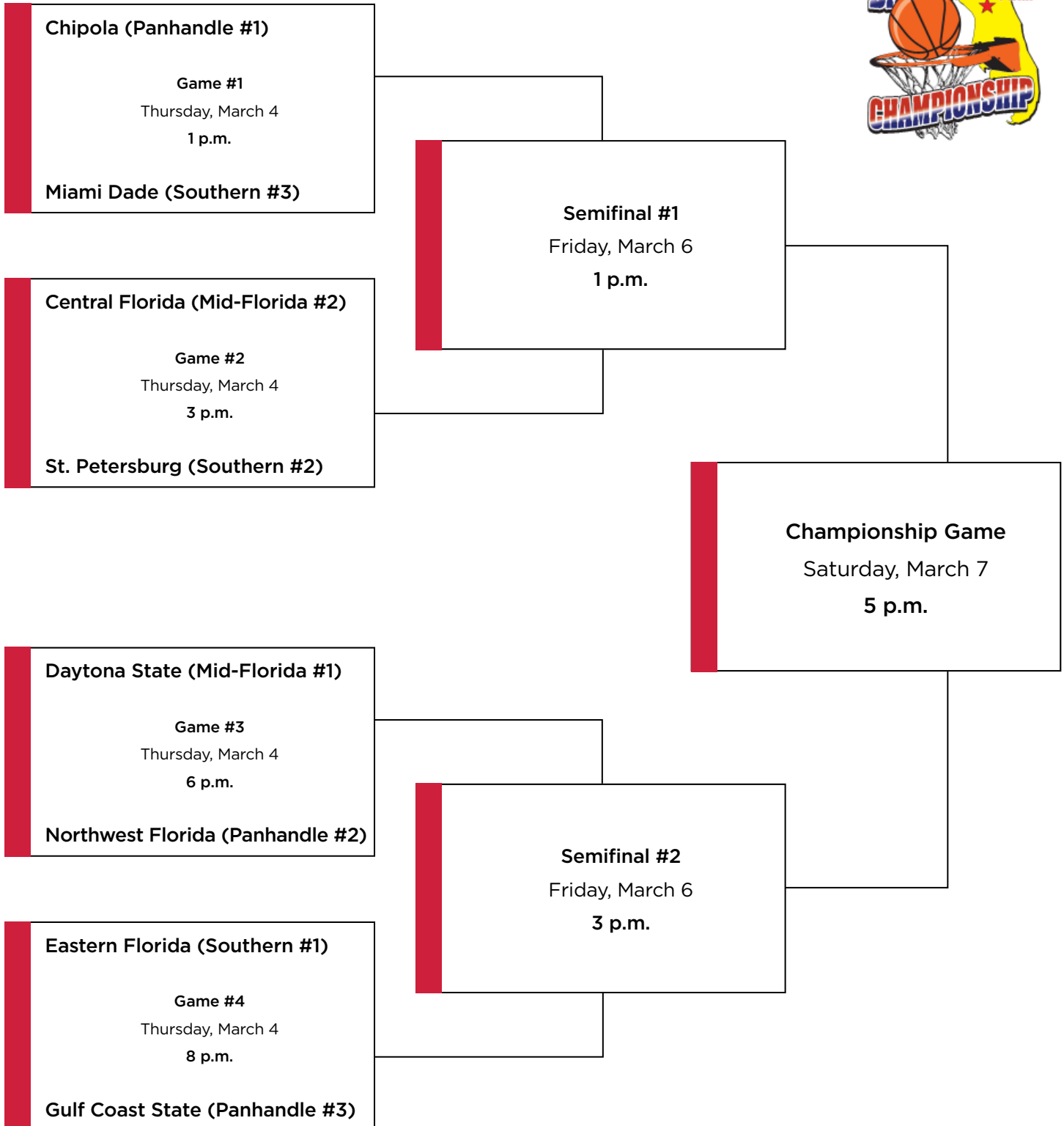

2014 FCSAA BASKETBALL COACH OF THE YEAR

PATRICK BLAKE



Patrick Blake helped get the **Chipola College** men's basketball team back to the top last season with its first NJCAA/FCSAA Region VIII championship since 2009. In the process, Blake earned the NJCAA/FCSAA Region VIII Coach of the Year honor in men's basketball in a season that saw the Indians ranked No. 1 in 12 of the 16 FCSAA coaches poll.

Blake is the first Chipola coach since Greg Heiar to win state coach of the year honors. With Blake's honor, the Indians have claimed coach of the year honors 11 times in men's basketball.

Blake had his team playing its best when it mattered most, as it wasn't that easy, though, for Chipola to make the state tournament.

The Indians needed a 69-64 win over two-time national tournament qualifier Northwest Florida State on the final day of the regular season to share the Panhandle Conference with Pensacola State.

Once Blake got the Indians to state, they rolled.

Chipola took out defending NJCAA National Champion, Central Florida, before downing an improved Polk State squad and scrappy St. Petersburg College.

Under Blake, the Indians finished 13-4 last season against teams ranked in the state coaches poll and 7-1 against state tournament teams. Blake, who just completed his third season as head coach at Chipola, entered the 2014-15 season with a 52-11 record.

A year ago, Cinmeon Bowers (Auburn), Sam Cassell, Jr. (UConn), Torian Graham (Houston), Carlos Morris (Minnesota) and Demetrious Floyd (Stephen F. Austin) all earned scholarships with NCAA Division I programs under Blake's guidance.

Chipola's championship last season came after it finished with a 26-5 record and runner-up spot in the Panhandle Conference. Prior to that, Blake spent two seasons as an assistant coach with the Indians.

Before coming to Chipola, he was a graduate assistant under Andy Kennedy at the University of Mississippi.

The Louisville graduate was a student manager at the school for Rick Pitino for four years, serving as the head manager for the final two. The native of Evansville, Ind., is the youngest of four siblings.

PATRICK HARRINGTON

The 2014-2015 season has been an emotional one for Northwest Florida State College and the entire women's basketball community. The excitement and anticipation of a promising season for the Lady Raiders was quickly negated after a serious car accident involving then head coach Patrick Harrington and his wife Lori occurred on Thursday, Oct. 2, 2014.

Just one week later, Coach Harrington, 51, passed away at Baptist Hospital in Pensacola, leaving behind his wife and three children, Kelly, Patrick Jr. and Katherine, the NWF State women's basketball team, and countless other loved ones throughout the world whom he had touched.

Harrington was set to enter his fifth year as head coach of the Northwest Florida State women's basketball program. A Boston native, he led the Raiders to a 100-25 record and back-to-back quarterfinal appearances in the NJCAA Division I National Tournament. Some of his most noteworthy accomplishments in leading the Lady Raiders include being the only program in the Panhandle Conference to earn four consecutive FCSAA/NJCAA Region 8 tournament appearances, leading the Lady Raiders to their first national tournament berth after an 18 year absence, guiding his program to back to back Elite 8 appearances in the NJCAA National Tournament, and having 100 percent of his players earn scholarships to four-year schools.

"What he accomplished in four years hadn't been accomplished here in 20 years," Northwest Florida State Athletic Director Ramsey Ross said. "What he did was put Northwest Florida State women's basketball back on the map. He really made it into a national power."

"During his years at NWF State College, Coach Harrington was not only an outstanding coach but he was a friend to all students, faculty and staff and the communities of NWF," added Ross. "As successful as he was on the court, Patrick was an even better person and family man. Patrick will be greatly missed by all."

Harrington's impact on Northwest Florida State College and its women's basketball program was immense, but his legacy will always be about so much more than just basketball.

2014 FCSAA BASKETBALL COACH OF THE YEAR

GREG FRANKLIN



After just missing out on the NJCAA/FCSAA Region VIII state championship the previous season, **Chipola College** earned its way back to the top of the state under coach **Greg Franklin** in 2014.

Franklin led the Indians to their first state championship since 2009 with a 68-50 win over rival Northwest Florida State last season. For his efforts, Franklin earned NJCAA/FCSAA Region VIII coach of the year honors.

Franklin joins David Lane as the only coaches in Chipola women's basketball history to earn state coach of the year honors. It also marked the fifth time that Chipola claimed a coach of the year honor in women's basketball and the first time since 2009.

Franklin's team in 2014-14 was dominant from the get-go.

Chipola finished 10-1 against teams that qualified for the state tournament last season and it entered the NJCAA National Tournament on a 22-game winning streak. The Indians were also the wire-to-wire No. 1 ranked team in the FCSAA Coaches Poll.

Chipola went 4-0 against fellow NJCAA National Tournament Qualifier Northwest Florida State on its way to a 34-2 overall record.

The Indians went undefeated in Panhandle Conference play for the first time in school history. Chipola went on to reach the NJCAA Final Four and ended up third in the nation.

It marked the second consecutive season the Indians reached the national tournament. In Franklin's first season, the Indians went 28-8 overall and qualified for nationals after finishing second in the state, behind Gulf Coast State. Once Chipola got to nationals, it managed to make the elite eight under Franklin.

Prior to Chipola, Franklin spent five seasons as an assistant coach at Mississippi State University. Franklin also was successful at Southeastern Illinois College where he led the program to a 154-25 record and a fourth-place finish in the NJCAA National Tournament in 2006-07.

He is a native of Central City, Ky. He graduated from Austin Peay University and was a standout player for the Governors, finishing with over 1,000 career points.
