5 STORIES OF 2016-2017

- 1.** The CF Foundation received the largest gift in its history, Vintage Farm. The 103-acre farm, valued at more than \$2.9 million, will provide hands-on learning opportunities for students in the college's Equine Studies and Agribusiness programs.
- 2.** Construction of the Jack Wilkinson Levy Campus, the first permanent facility for higher education in the county, was completed in time for fall classes. The college waived application fees and offered 100 scholarships valued at \$500 each for students enrolling at the campus for fall semester.
- 3.** The Marion County Hospital District committed \$6 million for a new state-of-the-art health sciences center, and the Florida Legislature committed \$2.5 million. Funding the new building is critical for workforce development and we are excited about future possible funding from the state.
- 4.** The college received a \$2.1 million, five-year grant to improve student success. Funding is allowing the college to redesign the first-year experience for students through a new first-year course, academic pathways, collaborative learning spaces, enhanced advising, tutoring and community engagement opportunities, as well as Faculty Fellows who are supporting these strategies to improve persistence and retention of first-year students and increase graduation rates.

- #10** Best Online College or University in Florida. OnlineColleges.com has ranked the College of Central Florida 10th out of 112 Florida peer institutions for Best Online College. In the past decade, CF has seen enrollment in online classes quadruple, growing from 3,957 in 2006-2007 to 16,506 in 2016-2017.
- #3 & #5** Accreditedschoolsonline.org ranks CF's Physical Therapist Assistant program third in the nation, among four-year schools, and Emergency Medical Services fifth in the nation.
- #30** Best College for Adult Education in the Nation according to GreatValueColleges.net. The ranking was developed from the 50 most affordable colleges on the U.S. News and World Report's list of 100 colleges and universities with the highest percentage of students over the age of 25.
- #20** Most Affordable College in the U.S. according to the U.S. Department of Education. CF tuition and fees for 2015-2016 were 68 percent below the national average of \$7,989 for public four-year or above institutions.

800 students, faculty and staff will be reached through the three-year \$294,930 Campus Suicide Prevention Grant from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services the college received in 2016.

77 credit hours will now earn students an Associate in Science in Radiography. Twenty students were accepted into the inaugural class in August 2017. Program graduates are eligible for licensure in Florida as a Certified Radiologic Technologists and may apply for admission to the certification examination administered by the American Registry of Radiologic Technologists.

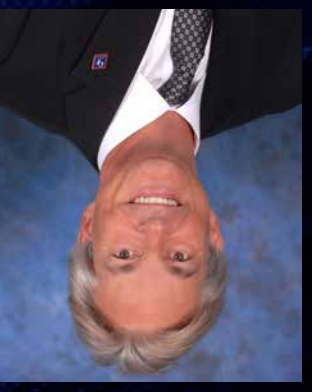

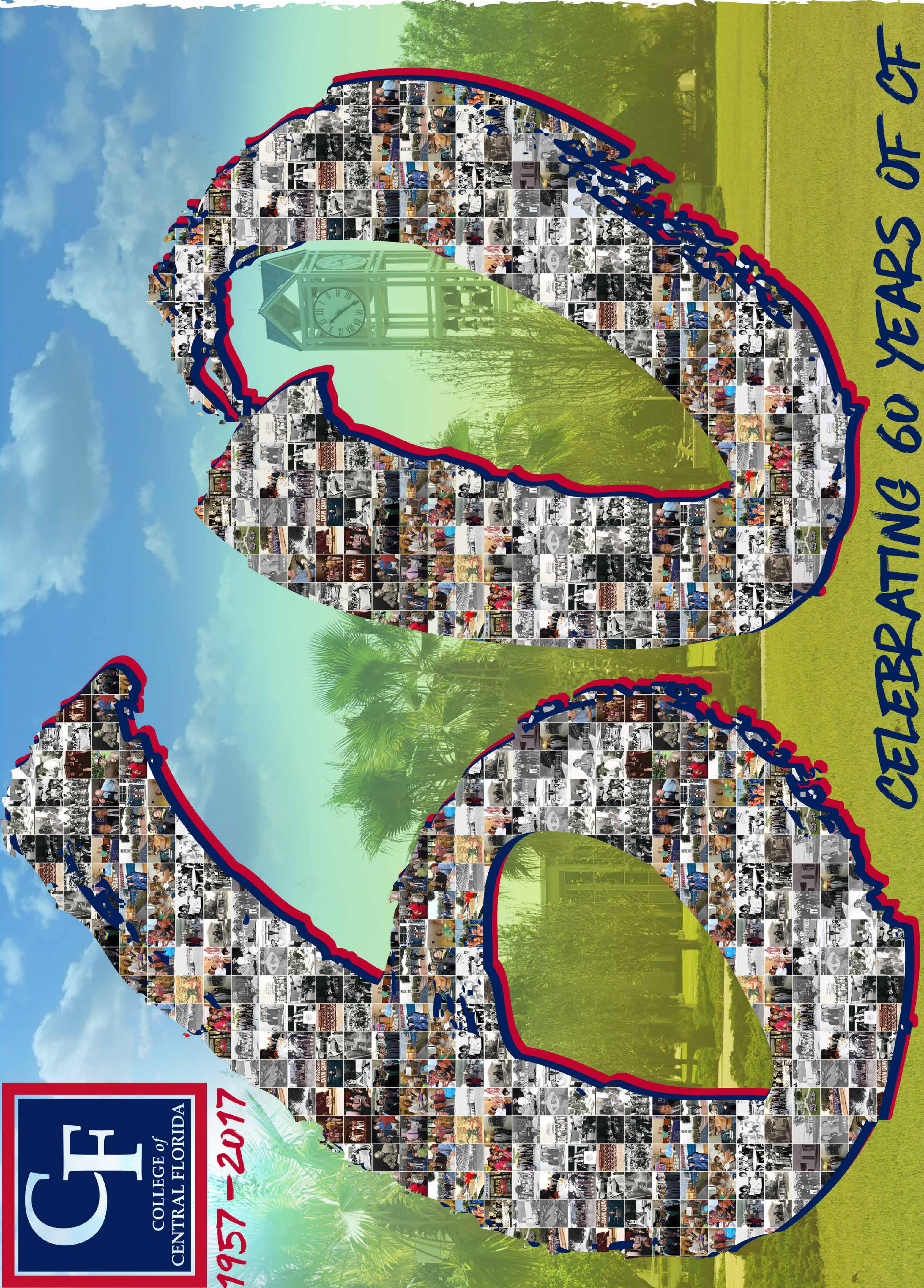
5. A Health Sciences Simulation Center opened at the Ocala Campus. It features patient simulators that expand clinical opportunities for nursing students and increases the capacity of CF nursing programs by 40 students. The Dental Clinic at the CF Hampton Center was expanded from five dental stations to 13. The clinic can now treat more than 6,000 adults annually.
