

Managing Difficult Behavior in Children - Albert Wright

We will explore practical ways to diffuse problematic behaviors and slow down their reoccurrence. There is absolutely a difference between difficult behavior and age-appropriate behaviors, and having a clear grasp of these differences is imperative. Understanding current trends in behavior and knowing the importance of positive reinforcement is a must. A happy and successful child makes for a happy and successful classroom.

Exploring Teacher Skills in Early Childhood Education through Technology Integration – Nermin Ciloglu Cakmakci

Technology has become an important tool in the modern classroom, affecting multiple aspects of education, including communication, teaching and learning. This systematic review examines how technology integration impacts teaching skills in early childhood education, focusing on the Technological Pedagogical Content Knowledge (TPACK) framework. It synthesizes 18 studies (2018–2024) from global databases using PRISMA guidelines. The review highlights benefits like improved teaching, creativity and addressing diverse learning needs while recognizing challenges such as equity and teacher training.
