Course Description

Course includes study of measurements, historical approach to chemistry, periodic table, gas laws, thermodynamics, chemical stoichiometry, acids, bases and oxidation/reduction.

Objectives

This course is intended to prepare students for the general chemistry courses (2045-2046). Those needing a less rigorous course with more emphasis on applications should take CHM1032 or 1020.

Textbook

Prerequisite

MAT1033 with a grade of "C" or better or equivalent or permission of instructor.

Calculator

A simple, scientific calculator with capabilities for square roots, logs, and exponential operations is required. This calculator will be used on tests, quizzes and homework assignments.

Tests

There will be four tests during the semester. All tests will be completed on-campus during class time. There is 1 attempt per test. Test dates are listed on Canvas. If the instructor determines that a student will take a test at another time due to a college activity or medical situation (must be documented emergency), the test will be administered in a proctored location and will be in an essay (non-multiple choice) format. These tests will only be given at other times under extreme circumstances and are up to the instructor's discretion.

Quizzes

There will be five quizzes during the semester. Quiz dates are listed on Canvas and will be completed online through Canvas. All quizzes must be completed on the assigned day and time. NO EXCEPTIONS! The lowest quiz grade will be dropped.

Homework Activities

There will also be a number of online homework activities on Canvas. Students have two attempts with each HW activity, with the average entered in the gradebook. The lowest homework activity grade will be dropped.

Practice Problems

In order to obtain required proficiency, students should work at a minimum all assigned practice problems in each chapter covered. Assigned practice problems are listed on Canvas. Since the answers to these questions are provided in the back of the textbook, credit will not be given for practice problems.

Grading Criteria

Overall grades will be calculated as follows:

- Test Scores-70%
- Homework Activities-20%
- Quizzes-10%

Grading Scale

Grades will NOT be rounded up. For example, an 89.9 is a B+ and an 86.8 is a B. There is no extra credit for the course!

Disputing Your Grade

If you feel that an error was made in grading an assignment, test, etc., you have one week from the time the grade was posted electronically on Canvas to dispute your grade. After one week, all grades are final and no changes will be made!

Withdraw








Right to Change Syllabus
