HOMEWORK ASSIGNMENTS

All assignments are due on the date as listed on the course syllabus schedule. Late work is not accepted except in extreme circumstances at the sole discretion of the instructor. I may require additional documentation. It is your responsibility to keep track of the due dates, do not expect weekly reminders that something is due.

COURSE SCHEDULE

This is not a completely self-paced course. New topics will be covered each week, and work will be required to be submitted each week. The new information will be posted by Tuesday morning at 8 am in a separate folder for the week. Each folder will include at least a power point presentation and a discussion post, though many will include additional material such as articles, video clips, quizzes, etc. You are responsible for all this information as well as the reading for that topic as assigned in the course schedule below. Assignments in each folder are due by the time the next folder is opened, the next Tuesday at 8 a.m. Once closed, assignments may not be made up except in extreme circumstances at the sole discretion of the instructor. This course ends December 6. No assignments will be accepted after December 6, and any assignments not submitted or submitted after December 6 will receive a 0 grade. There are no exceptions to this policy.

CANVAS

This course utilizes the Canvas system available to you via MyCF under the "Academics" tab. All course lectures and examinations will be posted in this system. This system also features a secure email system which will allow you to discuss your grade with the instructor without violating FERPA. This will be the primary method of communicating with me and I with you. Be sure to check your Canvas course site often as this is where important class information will be posted. Any issues regarding the system such as login etc. should be directed to distance learning ext. 1317. This system can be accessed remotely so you can use it at home.

ZOOM/TEAMS

Both Teams and Zoom are available free of charge to students. Contact Distance Learning at extension 1317 for assistance in setting up Zoom or if you are having difficulty running it. A webcam and microphone will be required, the integrated camera and microphone on your tablet/laptop will likely be sufficient. There are no regularly scheduled online meetings for this course, but you can use Zoom or Teams to contact the professor during the scheduled office hours. You will need to make an appointment ahead of time to do so.

EXAMINATIONS

All examinations for this class will be administered online via the Canvas system available through MyCF system. Exams must be taken during the time they are available on the course website. No makeup examinations will be given except in extreme circumstances as determined solely by the instructor. All material covered in the course website as well as in the assigned reading is considered "fair game" for the examinations. Exams can be administered in any method I see fit, including multiple choice, matching, short answer, essay etc. Exam reviews, both before and after the exam will be administered at the sole discretion of the instructor.

Honorlock will be utilized for the proctoring of the midterm and final online examinations. There will be a nominal cost to the student for this and a webcam will be required.

HONORLOCK

Honorlock will be utilized for the proctoring of the midterm and final online examinations taken on or off campus. There will be a nominal cost to the student for this and a webcam will be required- again your integrated camera should be sufficient. If you prefer to take the exam in a CF testing center that is acceptable as well. However, due to physical distancing restrictions access to the testing center will be limited, so you will need to schedule that with the testing center ahead of time. Scheduling time with the testing center is the sole responsibility of the student.

ONLINE DISCUSSION POSTINGS

You must keep up with the information that I post on the course website (CANVAS). This will include blog entries, news stories, research journal articles and discussion posts. Expect at least one discussion post every week which you will be required to take part in. I will be looking for meaningful and thoughtful responses which will be a minimum of eight sentences. Your postings should be majority your original thoughts, though supporting quotes are acceptable with proper citation (source) information. I expect proper spelling and grammar to be used as well as showing proper respect as though you were in the class. Failure to follow these policies will result in a lowering of the grade and further action that I deem necessary. Please note that merely fulfilling the minimum requirements will not guarantee a high grade for the assignment.

QUIZZES

Quizzes will be given throughout the semester. These quizzes will be taken via the Canvas system. If given, quizzes will be included in the weekly modules. However, please note that these quizzes are separate

assignments from the Mindtap Chapter Quizzes. Any course material, including readings and videos, can be used in the quizzes.

MINDTAP

Each week's module will contain homework from the Mindtap course shell. You will be able to access this from Canvas, but you must purchase a Mindtap code to be able to do so. All work assigned must be completed during that week. Late work will not be accepted.

Cengage grants a courtesy access period for a maximum of 7 calendar days to allow students time to purchase the correct Cengage access code. The 7 calendar days for the courtesy access period is established by Cengage and cannot be changed. After the courtesy access period ends, you will not be able to access any graded content in Mindtap or complete any graded work in Mindtap until a valid access code for this course is entered in Mindtap. Any graded work that you are not able to complete before the assignment's closing time (due to not entering a valid Mindtap access code for this course in Mindtap) receives a zero and cannot be completed after receiving a zero.

CENGAGE UNLIMITED

This course's textbook is from Cengage. If any of your other courses use Cengage material I recommend you consider signing up for Cengage Unlimited. This is a subscription based service for all Cengage material. The cost is \$120 per semester or \$180 per academic year and includes access to **all** Cengage material. See the bookstore for further information. Please note that while Mindtap access is required for this course, you are not required to purchase Cengage Unlimited for this course if you do not desire to do so.

GRADES

The instructor will post the student's grades in the Canvas course shell. It is the responsibility of the student to keep track of his/her own grades and current course average. Students are encouraged to check their grades under the Reports tab in Canvas for accuracy **before** the last day of the course. Students must contact the instructor before this date if there are questions or potential errors that need adjusting. After the last day of regular class sessions, it may be too late to make any changes to grades posted under the Canvas gradebook.

EXTRA CREDIT

Do not expect extra credit opportunities for this course. In the unlikely event that extra credit is offered it is at the sole discretion of the instructor and will be offered to the entire class. Individual extra credit will **NOT** be offered. Extra credit, if offered, cannot be made up. Cheating on extra credit will result in the same penalty as cheating on a normal assignment.

COURSE MATERIAL

A student shall not, without my express authorization, make or receive any type of recording, including but not limited to audio and video recordings, of any class, co-curricular meeting, organizational meeting, or meeting with me (except for class lectures.) You do not have permission to post recordings on the web. Further you do not have my permission to post my class lectures/course materials on the web. Zoom or Team meetings during office hours will not be recorded unless consent is given by both the instructor and the student.

Violation of academic integrity (including but not limited to attempts at cheating or plagiarism) will not be tolerated. I will have a General Questions discussion board available for you in the course website. This discussion board is also where I will post course announcements. If you have a question about the syllabus, the reading, an assignment or exam, this would be the place to ask it. Likely another student has the same question so it will be available to them as well. However, please keep in mind this is a PUBLIC forum, so anything that is personal in nature that you need to communicate to me should be done via the email system WITHIN Canvas. This is a completely private system, only I can see the message (as long as you send it to just me).

When you send a message either through the General discussion board or through the Canvas system, please allow 48 hours for a response during the week. Messages sent after 12:00 on Fridays may not receive a response until the following Monday.

COURSE COMMUNICATION

When communicating with the instructor and fellow students on the discussion boards or email, proper formatting, grammar and spelling are expected. So called internet speak or texting language is not appropriate for these environments.
