Course Description

This course may include an expanded review of CHM1025. The course covers atomic structure, bonding, formulas, nomenclature, reactions, stoichiometry, gas, solid and liquid states.

Objectives

This is the first semester of the general chemistry sequence offered at all state colleges and universities. The student should develop an understanding of atomic and molecular structure, the periodic table, gases, solutions, chemical reactions and stoichiometry. It is expected that students will have a background equivalent to CHM1025.

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Prerequisite

CHM1025 or equivalent with MAC1105 or higher with a grade of C or better

Calculator

A simple, scientific calculator with capabilities for square roots, logs, and exponential operations is required. This calculator will be used on tests, quizzes and homework assignments.

Tests

There will be four tests during the semester. Test dates are listed on Canvas. Students have one attempt and 120 minutes to complete each test. All tests must be completed by the assigned day and time. NO EXCEPTIONS!

Quizzes

There will be 10 quizzes during the semester. Quiz dates are listed on Canvas and will be completed online through Canvas. All quizzes must be completed by the assigned day and time. NO EXCEPTIONS! Students have one attempt and 30 minutes to complete each quiz. The lowest quiz grade will be dropped.

Homework Activities

There will be 10 homework assignments. Students have two attempts with each homework activity, with the highest grade entered in the gradebook. The lowest homework activity grade will be dropped. All homework assignments must be completed by the assigned day and time. NO EXCEPTIONS!

Discussion Forums

There are a total of five required discussion questions throughout the course. Discussion forums contribute to a deeper understanding of key concepts and allow you to interact with your classmates and the instructor. Initial posts are due by Thursday of each week with student replies by Saturday of each week. To earn full credit: you will need to post a response, respond to the original posts of at least two other students, and then contribute to an ongoing discussion. Late discussion posts are not accepted! Discussion forum guidelines include:

- Respect each other's ideas, feelings, and experience. Expect your classmates to have different opinions.
- Use proper writing style. Correct spelling and sentence structure are expected just as if you were writing a regular paper. Use spell check and grammar check before you submit.

- When responding to a classmate, address them by name.
- Do not use postings such as "I agree," "I don't know either," or "ditto." They do not add to the discussion, take up space on the Discussions, and will not be counted.

Grading Criteria

Overall grades will be calculated as follows:

- Tests-60%
- Homework Activities-20%
- Discussion Forums-10%
- Quizzes-10%

Grading Scale

Grades will NOT be rounded up. For example, an 89.9 is a B+ and an 86.8 is a B. There is no extra credit for the course!

Disputing Your Grade

If you feel that an error was made in grading an assignment, test, etc., you have one week from the time the grade was posted electronically on Canvas to dispute your grade. After one week, all grades are final and no changes will be made!

Withdraw

If you want to withdraw from this class, you must fill out the necessary forms and have them signed by the appropriate parties. If you just "stop coming to class" after the posted drop date, you may receive the grade of "F."

4. there may be a reason a withdrawal request may be denied.
