Music Appreciation

Course Description/Objectives

The instructor seeks to stimulate in students a curiosity and enthusiasm for music. With discussions of the musical elements, forms, historical periods, and the lives, styles, and representative works of some of the world's greatest composers, the instructor hopes this course will ultimately heighten the students' appreciation for music of all genres. The instructor also hopes this course will make students aware of the close connection between music and the other arts.

Materials

Students should purchase the **fifth** edition of Dr. Sarah Satterfield's **Music Appreciation: An Outline Guide**. The workbook supplement may be purchased from the bookstore, using the bookstore website/app, or directly through the [Kendall Hunt website \(Links to an external site.\)](#). The workbook is required for the class. Notes will be taken directly in the workbook based on recorded lectures posted under the "Files" tab on Canvas. The workbook may be used on tests.

Attendance Policy

Students are highly encouraged to attend the first-day Zoom session, which will provide an overview of the course. Attendance will be taken and used for the purposes of attendance verification. Students who are unable to attend this Zoom should respond to the follow-up email to confirm they understand how the course works.

Course Requirements

Students are expected to view, on their own, recorded lectures; turn in all assignment sets; and take all tests by the designated date/time.

A student will be referred to the Academic Integrity Seminar for cheating. This two-hour seminar costs \$40 (see Student Handbook). Each module includes one research-based assignment, one discussion-based assignment, and one test. The research-based assignment is worth 25 points, the discussion-based assignment 25 points, and the test 50 points.

Test Format

Test questions will be in multiple-choice format. Test questions will come from the workbook, which students will fill in using the posted PowerPoints/recorded lectures. All grades will be posted to the Canvas grade book.

Make-Up Policy

No make-up tests/assignments and no extensions will be given. Instead, the lowest module will be dropped. If modules 1-5 are completed, the final module is optional. To drop a score, however, all 6 modules (1-5 plus the final) must be completed.
