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Great Ideas For Teaching Students (G.I.F.T.S.): As members of a learning-centered college, we all teach students in some way, whether behind the scenes, around the college, online, or in front of a classroom.

#### **Morning G.I.F.T.S. Descriptions**

<u>General Overview of the CRM</u>: This session with Maureen Anderson is a general overview of the Admissions Customer Relationship Management system and how the college will improve communication with prospective students. In addition, we will review the capabilities (and limitations) of the new Admissions CRM. **Target audience**: Faculty and staff who are not directly responsible for marketing their programs and non-Student Affairs employees.

<u>Communication Overview in the CRM</u>: Learn the capabilities of the CRM to understand how we can improve communication about CF's programs and services. This session with Maureen Anderson will provide an overview of the Communication Plan so that program managers and coordinators can understand how and when information is provided to students and learn how to improve our marketing to students. **Target audience**: Program managers and program coordinators who are responsible for marketing their areas.

What's the BIG Deal about FERPA? In an age of communication and technology, it is important to stay current with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and how to protect yourself and the college while ensuring students' privacy. This refresher course with Dr. Alton Austin will address best practices when you are dealing with students' educational records. Target audience: All college employees who interact with students, their parents, and student records.

**LRC Tours**: Come tour the new spaces and behind the scenes with Karla Wilson and Dr. Tammi Viviano-Broderick to see what the Learning Resources Center and the new Learning Commons has to offer students. **Target audience:** All college employees.

Office 365 + Windows 10: Join Nancy Abshier and see what students encounter as they use Office 365 and Windows 10. **Target audience:** All college employees.

#### Morning G.I.F.T.S. Descriptions Cont.

Retention and Completion: This is a college-wide follow-up to discussion groups held with faculty in January. What do you think would help retain students and support their efforts to finish strong? Share your thoughts, learn about ideas others have suggested, and hear about some exciting applications of these ideas in the pipeline. This is a great opportunity to participate in collaborative discussions across departments and campus areas. Facilitated by Leah Gamble and Allan Danuff. Target Audience: All college employees.

Partners in Student Success: Faculty and Financial Aid: During this session, Financial Aid expert Jean Imes will explain the process of awarding financial aid to students, releasing monies for textbook purchases, and the role that faculty members play in ensuring accuracy and timeliness of disbursements. Learn more about attendance reporting and final grades, SAP (Satisfactory Academic Progress), temporary access codes for textbooks, fundable coursework, and the financial aid process including the FAFSA, verification, and scholarships. Together, we can help students be better prepared and, in turn, successful in the classroom. Target audience: All faculty.

Advising: Explore YOUR Role: Learn the WHATs, HOWs, WHENs, WHEREs, and WHYs of SUCCESSFUL Academic Advising with Debbie Bowe, Chenita Hart and Susan Thomas. We can't spell successful without U! Target audience: All Academic Affairs and Student Affairs employees.

<u>Accreditation...Who does that?</u>: Join Matt Matthews as he reviews the timelines for the SACSCOC accreditation 5th Year Report and the important processes for our overall accreditation reaffirmation. **Target audience**: All college employees.

**Sharing the CF Story**: CF faculty and staff are our greatest assets in promoting a college-going culture. Meet with Marketing and Public Relations team members Lois Brauckmuller and Danielle Doty to learn how they help promote your programs and how you can share the CF story. **Target audience:** All college employees.



### Student Affairs Afternoon G.I.F.T.S. Descriptions

<u>Enrollment Updates</u>: Join Dr. Saul Reyes for updates on college enrollment. **Target audience**: All Student Affairs employees.

**FERPA Staff Refresher**: In an age of communication in so many formats, it is important to stay current with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) laws and how to protect students' privacy. This refresher course with Dr. Alton Austin will address best practices when handling and communicating about students' educational records. **Target audience**: All Student Affairs employees.

**Overview of the New Admissions CRM**: This session with Maureen Anderson is an overview of the new recruitment and admissions processes, including how we can obtain names of prospective students and how we will communicate with students in the process. This session will also provide a brief introduction to how staff will use the CRM in their day-to-day activities. **Target audience**: Student Affairs employees and/or those directly responsible for interacting with students during the admissions and enrollment processes.

<u>Violence Against Women Act Refresher</u>: This session with Dr. Henri Benlolo will offer a refresher on the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA). **Target audience**: All Student Affairs employees.

#### Faculty Afternoon G.I.F.T.S. Descriptions

I Know A Great Lesson When I See It, But How Do I Create It?: AFC's 2018 Professor of the Year Brenda Skoczelas, from Lake Sumter State College, is offering this session. Exciting, engaging lessons that promote mastery look easy when someone else does it, but how do you create one when staring at a blank computer screen? This highly interactive session uncovers the common traits of great lessons and allows participants to leave with specific components to build their own creative lessons in any discipline!

**Baycare**: Learn how to handle disruptive and/or distressed students. You will learn how to: 1) Prevent disruptions, including disruptions caused by students with disabilities; 2) Identify warning signs of potentially harmful situations and how to defuse or de-escalate them; 3) Report inappropriate or potentially harmful behavior; 4) Identify signs associated with students who may be in distress; 5) Refer students to college resources for help; and 6) Understand the roles of the CF Special Admissions Committee and the CF Threat Assessment Team.

<u>Tutoring</u>: Come meet Chelsey, one of our outstanding CF tutors, who will share with you what kind of free tutoring is available for students in-person and online, and how you can help with some new tutoring initiatives to assist students and increase their success.

<u>Conferences in Canvas</u>: Join Cole Diaz and learn how to use the Conferences tool in Canvas to video or audio chat with one or more students. Share your desktop and walk students through something they are working on and with which they need assistance.

#### Faculty Afternoon G.I.F.T.S. Descriptions

<u>Canvas Gradebook</u>: Now that using the Canvas gradebook is required of all faculty members, come learn with Josh Strigle how to set up and use the gradebook and ways to make it work best for you.

<u>Curriculum Builder</u>: Curriculum Builder is a Canvas plugin that allows faculty members to search their library's content from within the Learning Management System (LMS) and create reading lists for students. Join Faithe Ruiz and learn how to organize scholarly articles, e-book chapters, online reference materials, and more from within course modules.

<u>PrepSTEP: Tutorials and Practice Tests for Student Success</u>: PrepSTEP is a dynamic online learning platform from EBSCO and LearningExpress presenting tutorials, practice tests, and e-books which empower students to build foundational skills for college success. With PrepSTEP students can: improve core English, math and science skills; score higher on college placement tests; acquire basic computer skills; build workplace skills and explore careers; prepare for grad school and occupational exams; and succeed in college and beyond. Teresa Faust and Rebecca Schweighardt will introduce PrepSTEP and demonstrate how PrepSTEP can be used to support course work and student success.

StartSmart Academic Pathways: Come meet with Karla Wilson and Lois Kohlweiss and find out how students determine their Academic Paths, where the paths can be found on the web, and how to help students understand the importance of creating personal paths and staying on them. We will discuss the Pathways process and how you can help students be successful.

**Tech Tips: Interesting Engaging Technologies**: Let Brandy Currie show you how to communicate with students in the medium they prefer by using the free Remind App. You can also learn how to develop a portfolio project for your students using a webbased platform.
