

CF DUAL ENROLLMENT PROGRAM

Dual Enrollment Benefits

- The CF Dual Enrollment program provides college courses that meet high school graduation requirements and are transferable to universities.
- Dual Enrollment jumpstarts a student's college career and is close to home.
- Students can complete college courses at a reduced cost, which can help avoid student loan debt and get students on the path to academic and career success.
- Students are offered access to college resources, facilities and services, including tutoring and advising. They can also join clubs, participate in activities and enjoy getting involved on campus.

Program Criteria

Admission

Requirements for consideration:

- Eligible students in grades 6-12 with at least four completed high school credits.
- Submission of an online CF Dual Enrollment application by the application deadline.
- Submission of acceptable, current scores on an approved placement exam (SAT, ACT, PERT, PSAT, PreACT).
- Submission of a current high school transcript with appropriate high school GPA.
- Verify eligibility with high school counselor.

Registration

- Students living in-district will attend mandatory in-person orientation.
- While attending orientation, students will self-register with advisor assistance.

Passing Test Scores

Passing test scores for each test are as follows:
