



Dual Enrollment Benefits

- The CF Dual Enrollment program provides college courses that meet high school graduation requirements and are transferable to universities.
- Dual Enrollment jumpstarts a student's college career and it's close to home.
- Tuition is free and college textbooks are provided at no cost to public and home school students in the CF Dual Enrollment program.
- Students are offered access to college resources, facilities and services, including tutoring and advising. They can join clubs, participate in activities and get involved on campus.

Program Criteria

Admission:

Submit all of the following by the deadline:

- Eligible students in grades 6-12 with at least four completed high school credits.
- Submission of an online CF Dual Enrollment application by the application deadline.
- Submission of acceptable, current scores on an approved placement exam (SAT, ACT, PERT).
- Submission of a current high school transcript with appropriate high school GPA.
- Passing scores on the Florida Statewide Assessment for reading and the End-of-Course (EOC) Assessment for algebra (public school students).

Registration:

- Appropriate paperwork from the high school (public and private school counselors will email registration form), or registration form for home schooled students at time of registration.

Passing Test Scores:

Test scores are only valid for two years after the initial test date. Passing test scores for each test are shown below.

All new students must complete an online application and submit all required documents by the posted application deadline to participate in the program.

Spring Priority Admissions Deadline	Sept. 27, 2019
Spring Late Admissions Deadline	Nov. 1, 2019

Registration Information and Dates:

- Registration requests for public and private school students are coordinated with the guidance counselor and are processed by CF staff.
- Home school students provide the registration form, in person, on appropriate registration date.
