Dual Enrollment Guide

For High School Students

Start college while in high school

Dual enrollment is your chance to get ahead! Open to public, private, and homeschool students, dual enrollment lets you earn college credit while still in high school.

Each semester, hundreds of students choose CF to jump-start their future with the support and resources they need to succeed. Types of Dual Enrollment

Traditional Dual Enrollment

A more flexible option allowing students to take 1-4 classes each semester, getting a head start on finishing their college degree after high school.

CF Collegiate Academy

An accelerated program in which students finish high school by 10th grade, then attend CF full time in 11th and 12th grades to complete a college degree.

Traditional Dual Enrollment

By enrolling in CF's **traditional dual enrollment program**, you'll have the flexibility to incorporate college classes into your high school schedule. Designed for students wanting a head start on their college education, traditional dual enrollment can be as little as a single college class, taken either online or at a CF campus. Classes are offered many times throughout the week so that you can earn college credit alongside your high school classes and extracurriculars.

To be eligible for traditional dual enrollment, you must be in grades 6-12 with at least 4 completed high school credits, an unweighted 3.0 GPA, and passing placement test scores.

Credit limits by grade:

- 6th-8th grade: **3 credit hours** (1 class) each semester
- 9th grade: **up to 6 credit hours** (2 classes) each semester and during summer
- 10th grade: **up to 6 credit hours** (2 classes) each semester and up to **9 credit hours** (3 classes) during summer
- 11th grade: **up to 9 credit hours** (3 classes) each semester and up to **12 credit hours** (4 classes) during summer
- 12th grade: **up to 16 credit hours** each semester

CF Collegiate Academy

CF Collegiate Academy gives motivated high school students the chance to fast-track their education by earning both a high school diploma and an Associate in Arts (A.A.) or Associate in Science (A.S.) degree at the same time. This unique program provides a rigorous academic experience while allowing you to attend CF full time during your junior and senior year.

Eligibility Requirements

- Have a **3.0 unweighted GPA** to qualify and maintain it along with CF's minimum GPA to stay eligible.
- Pass the Grade 10 FAST ELA assessment and the Algebra 1 EOC exam.
- Have completed **12 high school credits** to join (no longer eligible after four years of high school or upon graduation).
- Have completed all high school requirements in 9th and 10th grade.

Enrolling in CF Collegiate Academy

If you're interested in enrolling, you should express interest by the end of 8th grade and work with your high school counselor during 9th and 10th grade. Tenth graders also must submit the online dual enrollment application by the posted deadline, which is available at least one semester in advance on [CF.edu/CollegiateAcademy](https://cf.edu/CollegiateAcademy).

Once admitted, Collegiate Academy students commit to a full-time college course load, which includes:

- **12 to 18 credit hours** (4–6 classes) each semester
- **Up to 12 credit hours** during the summer term

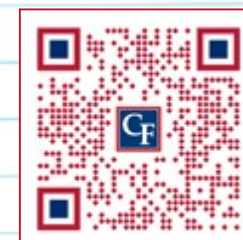
Your Next Steps

- ☐ Schedule your PERT exam through the testing webpage at [CF.edu/Testing](https://cf.edu/testing).
- ☐ Submit the free Dual Enrollment Application at [CF.edu/Apply](https://cf.edu/apply).
 - > If you attend public or private school, you can begin the application through your school counselor.
 - > If you are a homeschool student, have your parent or guardian submit the Dual Enrollment application packet
- ☐ Complete the required documents, receive your CF ID# and return the forms to your high school counselor.
- ☐ Once admitted, you will need to register for CF Orientation and register for classes.

Admissions requirements

- > 3.0 unweighted GPA
- > Passing scores on placement test (PERT, SAT, ACT, CLT)
