**Civics Literacy**

Effective Fall 2021, to satisfy F.A.C. 6A-10.02413, competency in civic literacy is a requirement for all students receiving an associate degree. Competency in civic literacy must be demonstrated in the following ways:

- Successful completion of either POS2041 American National Government or AMH2020 United States History Since 1877, **and**
- Achieving a standard score on an approved assessment. Current approved assessment options include the following:

Assessment	Standard Score
AP Government and Politics: United States	3
AP United States History	4
CLEP: American Government	50
Florida Civic Literacy Examination	60%

**Foreign Language – graduation requirement**

Effective Fall 2014, F. S. s. 1007.262, requires demonstration of foreign language competency for Associate in Arts degree seeking students. Foreign language competency must be demonstrated through the completion of either two sequential courses in high school foreign language or the equivalent at the postsecondary level. Students enrolled in foreign language courses at CF must earn a grade of C or better before advancing to the next level. Students should consult with an advisor if they wish to satisfy this requirement with a CLEP exam score.
