The College of Central Florida encourages freedom of expression and the creation and presentation of various forms of individual, artistic and political expression as a means to enhance the educational and cultural opportunities to its students and community.

Expression will not be permitted which constitutes: (1) true threats; (2) libelous material; (3) incitement of illegal activities; (4) copyright infringement; or (5) harassment aimed at an individual on the basis of a protected characteristic that is also pervasive and severe, is a direct or implied threat to employment or education, or creates an intimidating, hostile and demeaning atmosphere.

Events may be limited to a time and location that maximizes the chance that such event will proceed successfully and that the campus community will not be made unsafe. The Vice President of Student Affairs or his or her designee may perform a risk assessment and require individuals to take appropriate steps in this regard, which may include requiring additional security personnel. Further, the College may invoke time, place and manner discretion, for example, to ensure that an event with a highly controversial speaker would be held in a venue that the College believes to be protectable. The College reserves the right to decline or cancel any event if officials determine it poses serious safety risks and imposes an imminent threat of violence to the campus community.

Attendance at such artistic and cultural endeavors is voluntary. Any student or the parent of a minor student should consult the Vice President of Student Affairs or his or her designee if he or she finds the content of any public forum to be offensive. In such case, efforts will be made to provide alternative experiences.

The President or the President’s designee will establish a procedure regarding this policy.
