The Citrus Campus is CF's second-largest campus and features multiple computer labs, state-of-the-art biology and chemistry labs and outstanding training opportunities for future medical professionals, including a hospital room suite equipped with patient simulators. Academic Programs

The Citrus Campus offers a number of degree and certificate programs, including the Associate in Arts degree, which is typically the track students would pursue to transfer to a four-year bachelor's degree program. Student Services


The Educational Opportunity Center is a federal program offering counseling and information on college admissions and financial aid to qualified adults.

The Testing Center offers a variety of services required for admission and placement into academic and vocational programs, as well as for special fields of training. Many types of tests are available to students, local industries, and the public at CF Citrus including PERT, CLEP, HESI and WONDERLIC. Career Scope, a free interest and aptitude test for education and career guidance, is also available.

The Learning Resources Center offers hundreds of books, e-videos, e-books and publication databases for research. Study with a group in private study rooms with white boards and projectors, or alone in individual study pods with foot rests and electrical outlets.

The Learning Support Center offers group and private tutoring in many subjects.

Students who earn their A.A. degree are guaranteed admission to one of Florida's public universities. The process is seamless with the University of Central Florida **DirectConnect™ to UCF** or University of South Florida **FUSE** program.







Dual Enrollment

High school students may earn college credit through Dual Enrollment. Students take classes at their high school campus or the CF Citrus Campus and earn dual credits for high school and college.
