


Dental Hygiene[†] (88 credit hours)

Dental Assisting[†] (50 credit hours)

Emergency Medical Services[†] (73 credit hours)

A hands-on career as an EMT and Paramedic, or advanced position such as EMS educator or administrator.



Paramedic[†] (42 credit hours)

Providing advanced emergency medical treatment and trauma management. Applicants must be Florida-certified EMTs.



Emergency Medical Technician -Basic[†] (12 credit hours)

Providing basic prehospital emergency medical services. No prior experience required.



Critical Care Transport[†] (Noncredit)

Caring for critically ill patients during transit from one medical facility to another.
