This campus serves as our teaching laboratory to ensure our Equine Studies and Agribusiness students are equipped with the best hands-on experiences to tackle workplace issues they will face in their chosen careers. This world-class resource facility has classrooms, labs and will add a covered arena training center that will be used for demonstrations, labs, and livestock judging events for both local primary and secondary schools.

The Florida horse industry generates more than 72,000 jobs and more than 224,000 Floridians are involved in the industry as horse owners, service providers and employees. Degree Offerings

Bachelor's Degree

Bachelor of Applied Science in Business and Organizational Management

Agribusiness Management Specialization (120 credit hours)

This specialization prepares students to work for farm and agricultural businesses.

Equine Studies Specialization (120 credit hours)

This program prepares students for a career in the ever-developing equine industry.



CF is ranked in the top 1% in the U.S. for affordability, among public four-year or above institutions, according to the U.S. Department of Education.



Associate in Science Degrees

Agribusiness Management (60 credit hours)

Students receive both classroom knowledge and actual experience at an agricultural production facility to learn how to manage commodities and businesses.

Equine Studies

Business Management Specialization (60 credit hours)

This degree is ideal for the student who plans to manage an equine farm, equine retail center or establish a service-based equine business.

Equine Exercise Physiology Specialization (60 credit hours)

This program focuses on supporting high performance horses, such as race horses or Olympic horses. Students study exercise physiology, rehabilitation and locomotion.

College Credit Certificates

Equine Assistant Management (24 credit hours)

This certificate program helps prepare students for employment in a variety of equine enterprises.



CF classes are offered during the day, evening and online to better suit the needs of our students, whether they are first time in college or already employed and looking to advance their career.



Equine Technician (15 credit hours)

This certificate program teaches horse ownership and subjects such as pre-purchase examinations, nutrition, vaccination protocols and more. This program is offered completely online.

Horticulture Specialist (15 credit hours)

This certificate program teaches students hands-on-skills while helping them become proficient in general horticulture knowledge, plant and pest/disease identification.

Skilled Cattle Worker (30 credit hours) *Coming Fall 2020*

Students will learn how to oversee livestock and cattle facilities, along with how to manage crops, machinery, equipment and analyze financial, production and personnel records.

Student Clubs

CF Equestrian Club members host speakers from the equine industry, visit farms, volunteer at shows and participate in collegewide activities. Students have hosted a debate on animal rights versus animal rescue, and have assisted with a local rescue for horses.

CF Agribusiness Club provides opportunities in agriculture to members and the community to learn and develop skills, promote awareness and foster networking in the industry.



CF maintains small class sizes with a 28:1 student to faculty ratio.
