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1. Getting There

4. Seating & Tables

- \square Are there tables or seating areas with space for wheelchair users?
- \square Are counters or desks low enough to reach comfortably?

5. Signs & Information

- ☐ Are signs easy to read (large print, clear fonts, good contrast)?
- \square Is there Braille or tactile signage for those with visual impairments?

6. Lighting & Sound

- ☐ Is lighting bright enough to see clearly?
- ☐ Is noise controlled so people can hear and focus?

7. Technology & Communication

- ☐ Are assistive devices available (like listening systems or captioning)?
- \square Are materials or announcements available in accessible formats?

8. Safety

- ☐ Are emergency exits accessible for everyone?
- \square Are evacuation plans posted and inclusive of individuals with disabilities?
