Free Application for Federal Student Aid, or FAFSA, is Changing:

The FAFSA is available right now. The income used on the FAFSA will be from two years prior to the application year (referred to as “Prior-Prior Year”). This means students will use their 2016 tax return to apply for 2018-2019 aid.

This important change streamlines the college application process for students. Now they will be able to apply for aid at the same time many are applying for college.
